Randy will be spraying a fungicide and putting on sulfur. You get get a bag at D and B Supply reasonable. You can also use the sulfur on all of your flower beds and lawns. I do not trim off the leaves as I like the growth to the plant. Six months till first bloom on a Mediate Drawf Bloom.

The look you get from some family members when they find out how many Irises you have purchased this year , the little twinges of back pain at night caused from weeding that day , the fear of leaving home for more than a few days for fear that you will come back to a Jumanji jungle , and of course the realization that you will NEVER have attractive finger nails.
